3 *Taking into consideration* the constant conflict in the Middle East and Northern Africa, especially in the
4 Republic of Yemen,
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6 *Alarmed by* the usage of third party countries as proxies and the damage done to such countries,
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8 *Taking into account* the rise of radical Islam in the Republic of Yemen and its neighboring countries,
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10 *Aware of* numerous violent uprisings in the broader Middle East, including but not limiting to the
11 Republic of Yemen,
12
13 *Acknowledging* the interlink between poverty, corruption, and economic instability, which provides a
14 fertile ground for social dissatisfaction, thus contributing to ideological radicalization, and engagement
15 in extremist groups, such as, but not limited to terrorist networks;
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17 *Further Acknowledging* that the roots of the Houthi Militia Forces lie within the causes outlined in the
18 previous preambulatory clause, as well as the Shaifai's and Zayydi's dissatisfaction with the former
19 political system of the Republic of Yemen;
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21 1. **Proposes** to fight the radicalization of the youth in countries affected by civil war via establishing
22 a department in the United Nations Youth Organization, which informs about the dangers of
23 war;
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25 2. **Calls upon** all UN Member States to reaffirm their full support of the legitimacy of Mr. Abdo
26 Rabbo Mansour Hadi as President of the Republic of Yemen, as demanded in United Nations
27 Security Council Resolution 2216 (2015) and the Statement by the President of the United
28 Nations Security Council dated March 22nd, 2015;

30 3. **Requests** that all UN Member States actively participate in alleviating the humanitarian crisis
31 brought about by different factors such as, but not limited to famine and cholera in Yemen and
32 submit the amount of financial aid pledged to the Humanitarian Response Plan;
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34 4. **Asks** the UN Member States of the Gulf Cooperation Council to formally invite the Republic of
35 Yemen to join their Council, as soon as the situation in the Republic of Yemen has been

30 stabilized, to enable the country to build up and improve relations with its neighbouring
31 countries, thereby securing a political and economic recovery as well as long-lasting stability of
32 the Arabian Peninsula,

33 a. Stability shall be defined as the value of 0.655 being reached referring to measurement
34 of the Human Development Index;

36 5. **Requests** the installment of an appointed, democratically legitimized transitional government
37 without leaving out groups based on religion, race, or political preferences, and with President
38 Abdrabbuh Mansur Hadi as head of the transitional government until a democratic election
39 takes place the date of which shall be agreed upon in negotiations;

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41 6. **Requests** that the United Nations Security Council Counter-Terrorism Committee (CTC) and
42 therefore the Counter-Terrorism Committee Executive Directorate (CTED) are designated the
43 task of:

44 a. Further examining the dimensions of influence of terrorist groups such as AQAP and ISIL,

45 b. Proposing solutions to decrease the leverage of the aforementioned groups;

46 7. **Demands** that all parties involved in the Yemeni conflict resolve their conflict peacefully through
47 dialogue and refrain from unilateral action which could undermine a peaceful political resolution
48 of the conflict;

50 8. **Condemns** all trade and communication with Al-Qaeda in the Arabian Peninsula (AQAP) and the
51 Islamic State in Syria and the Levant (ISIL also known Da'esh) in direct opposition to embargoes
52 established by the United Nations;

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54 9. **Decides** to remain actively seized of the matter.
