



### Presidential Statement (Crisis Resolution)

At the 19<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Security Council, held on 20 May 2019, in connection with the Council's consideration of the item entitled "Venezuela – Tackling a Humanitarian, Economic and Political Crisis" and in connection with rapidly changing situation at the Venezuelan – Columbian boarder, the presidency made the following statement on behalf of the council:

- 3 1. **Condemns** Maduro's order to stop the convoys, delivering emergency relief to Vene-
- 4 zuela;

- 6 2. **Urges** all parties involved in the situation to come to a ceasefire agreement, including
- 7 the condition of disarmament of the Venezuelan military;
- 8
- 9 3. **Stresses** that in case of Venezuela violating the ceasefire agreement, Venezuela will
- 10 have to face military intervention by troops of UN member countries, within a UN
- 11 peacekeeping mandate, led by a UN command;
- 12
- 13 4. **Invites** the responsible head of the military forces of Venezuela, President Maduro,
- 14 Mister Guaido and an international, neutral contact group sent from the United Na-
- 15 tions, lead by the presidency of the Security Council, to discuss the current escalation
- 16 of the situation and how to solve it in order to ensure peace and stability.
