## Causes of conflict and proposals for peace

This year's OLMUN is approaching. Only a few hours are left until the Opening Ceremony marks the beginning of OLMUN 2022. As it is the case every year, the Secretary has invited several guest speakers to attend the ceremony or send a video message. Among them are Jürgen Krogmann, mayor of Oldenburg, Christoph Baak who is affiliated with the CDU and Susanne Menge, member of the German „Bundestag“ and the Alliance „Bündnis 90/ Die Grünen.“

Three days of exciting debates and committee sessions, as well as evening entertainments, lie ahead. About 350 delegates from different nationalities like the Netherlands, Turkey and the Czech Republic are to participate in this year's conference.

In 2022, the OLMUN revolves around the slogan “Causes of Conflict and Proposals for Peace”. Examples all around the world demonstrate that conflicts of any kind can arise anywhere, sometimes even when they are least expected. A recent one is the ongoing war in Ukraine which has and will continue to have fatal consequences for its citizens and the relationships between nations within and outside of Europe.

In order to resolve existing conflicts or to prevent them from breaking out altogether, it is essential to identify how and why they emerge in the first place. To allow students to do so the Inner Circle has decided to establish seven committees. In every committee different topics will be discussed, however, they all relate to the overall theme of the OLMUN 2022.

Especially contributing to the slogan, the First Committee of the General Assembly (GA 1st) which is led by Keara Hartschuh, Arik Luhn and Juliana Rashidwill, evaluates the topic “Ethics and Handling of Drones and Self-Firing Weapon Systems”. Also dealing with the issue of war is the Security Council (SC). The discussion about the topic “Yemen – A War With No End In Sight” will be supervised by Clara von Kirchbach and Isabella von Jan.

The majority of people living in Europe are privileged with fundamental human rights and their enforcement. Others, however, have to fight every day to ensure their rights and it is crucial for those who are privileged to support the ones who are not.
