UNESCO is a specialized agency of the United Nations (UN) established in 1945, with the mandate to contribute to peace and security by promoting international cooperation through education, science, and culture in order to achieve the Sustainable Development Goals. At OLMUN, 51 member states are represented.

- a) The equal dignity of all human beings calls for the wide diffusion and access to culture, education, and the free flow of ideas and knowledge.
- **b)** To achieve lasting peace and security around the world, we must harness the power of education, science and culture to bring out the best in our shared humanity, foster mutual understanding and respect for human rights.
- c) To help people live as global citizens free of hate and intolerance, every child and adult must be afforded access to quality education, tools and resources, irrespective of gender or origin.
- d) To strengthen bonds among all nations, the preservation and protection of cultural heritage and the equal dignity of all cultures, on all continents, is fundamental.
- e) To tackle the gravest social, environmental and ethical challenges facing humanity, from climate and biodiversity crises to questions raised by digital and scientific progress, we need to support scientific research, innovation and cooperation." 1

3. Promoting Equal Access to Quality Education

3.1. Importance of the Topic

This year's topic refers to the fourth Sustainable Development Goal: "Ensure inclusive and equitable quality education and promote lifelong learning opportunities for all." With this topic we aim to raise your awareness for the one very central puzzle piece on our way to a peaceful and fair future, which is education. Educated citizens of a country have learned how to survive, they have understood the problems in the world and – hopefully – they were made aware of their own power to make a difference. To overcome a problem, it is necessary to first perceive a matter as a problem. To do so, it is crucial to be educated. This also is the case for finding solutions e.g., by reading books and doing research on a topic.

3.2. Definition

Regarding this topic, "education" implies both the acquisition of knowledge by children as well as the continued learning journey in higher educational institutions such as colleges and universities. Concerning the access to education there are multiple aspects to keep in mind, e.g., restricted access due to high costs which an individual is unable to afford. Other aspects could be ethnic and cultural exclusion or the impossibility of reaching an educational institution due to logistic reasons. Also keep in mind the everyday tasks an individual may have to complete, which could keep them from spending their time studying. "Quality Education" implies any educational institution which at least matches local standards if it does not exceed them. In the future, we must remove inclusion barriers, establish equality, and overcome Learning Poverty.

3.3. Recent Developments Concerning the COVID-19-Pandemic

The Covid-19 Pandemic has caused a global education crisis which had severe effects on learning. 1.6 billion learners have been affected by school closing and remote learning, with consequences to handle for the next decades. A report by the world bank estimates a loss of \$17 trillion in lifetime earnings, which is 14% of todays global GDP. Even though almost every country offered remote learning opportunities, they varied immensely in effectiveness, depending on the wealth of each country. This has caused an increasing imbalance between different countries, known as "Learning Poverty", which is defined as the percentage of 10-year-old children who cannot read and understand a simple story. In low-income countries, the newest data shows that the number of children who are not able to read and understand a simple story is 53 percent. In developing countries, the number has partly risen up to

80% due to the pandemic.² Furthermore, around 10 million students are expected to never return to school again, as they were forced to start working to support their family in times of the crisis. However, we should now take the window of opportunity which was opened by this education crisis and take steps forward to resolve this issue in order to create a more peaceful and humane world with the help of quality education.

4. How to Prepare for This Year's Conference

Please have a look at the resources that we provide for you, as they will help you to prepare for this years topic. We would like you all to send in a Policy Statement which briefly represents the views of your delegation within a maximum of 200 words. Bear in mind that presenting your Policy Statement will help you within during the lobbying phase and the process of writing a resolution.

Furthermore, you have to hand in a Draft Resolution, which should be at least one page, focusing on the operative clauses. Of course it does not have to be perfect yet, please send us both your **Draft Resolution and your Policy Statement until May 31st**.

You can find detailed information about the structure and expected language and terms of such documents in the OLMUN Handbook on our website.

If you have any questions about writing the Policy Statement or the Draft Resolution, please do not hesitate to contact us! We will look through all your ideas and give a short feedback, just so you are better prepared for the conference and are safe to present your ideas. Sending in a Policy Statement and Draft Resolution is mandatory, and people who did not send it in might find themselves on a list for punishments during the conference.;)
