15	Acknowledging that the suppression of women that is justified by religion has been built upon				
16	patriarchal foundations and has a complex history of sexism and discrimination,

18	Emphasizing that any kind of psychological or physical abuse and violence contradicts the				
19 20	Universal Declaration of Human Rights as well as the values of religions aiming for peace and compassion,

22	1. <u>Strengthens</u> legal framework by:				
23	a. criminalizing harmful practices,				
24	b. implementing effective enforcement mechanisms such as:				
25	i. establishing specialized courts that prompt investigation and prosecution of				
26	causes related to the abuse of religion against women;

28	2. <u>Promotes</u> education and awareness through:				
29	a. integrating gender equality and women's rights into both school and religious				
30	curriculum as well as school policies to foster an understanding of equal rights and				
31	respect from an early age,				

32		b.	sensitize religious leaders by:
33			i. conducting workshops and training programs for religious leaders for them
34			to promote gender equality and the important of respecting women's rights
35			within religious framework if needed,
36		c.	promoting equal education world-wide by supporting organization such as
37			UNICEF that aim for equal education in every state,
38		d.	mandatory role model behavior of all civil servants,
39		e.	making school a place, which though it may educate all about different religions,
40			neither promotes nor condemns any religion,
41		f.	preventing religions from denying girls to education;

45			i. implement initiatives that provide skill development, entrepreneurship
46			opportunities, and access to credit for women, enabling them to become

49		b.	administrating support services to provide assistance and protection to women who
50			face abuse or discrimination based on religious beliefs to overcome the long-lasting

69	5.	Calls	upon the creation of a Religious Abuse Survivor Support committee that oversees
70		the mo	onitoring of educational resources and aid:

	i. representatives selected by multiple member states within the UN Women	
	committee,	
	ii. women's health professionals,	
	b. implementing appropriate training measures for all members including background	
	checks, briefings, and bi-weekly check ins and evaluations;	
6.	Hopes that all member states support the combat against the abuse of religion against	
	women and take all possible measures to erase this issue contributing to:	
	a. fulfilling the 2030 Sustainable Development Goals,	
	b. protecting the pure and peaceful intents of religions,	
	c. securing women's rights;	
7.	Calls for a National Subforce Protection Plan that:	
	a. protects women in communities, which also includes that women and girls can	
	neither be forced to wear any type of religious covering nor be denied the right to	
	wear religious coverings of any types,	
	b. deploys a subforce in each country separate from their police force,	
	i. only active if needed,	
	c. encouraged every country to willingly deploy this to other countries in need of help;	
8.	<u>Requesting</u> funding from the following places:	
	a. partnerships with women-empowerment NGOs & institutions,	
	b. the UN trust fund to end violence against women,	
	c. funds from the UN Women's empowerment principles fund,	
	d. suggests that all nations, especially those with a 450 billion \$ gross domestic	
	product (GDP) and higher to participate in a fund to finance the changes & projects	
	implemented in the resolution.
