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Resolution 2026/0001

Resolution adopted by [Full Committee Name] on 18 June 2026

Ensuring the Equal Economic Participation of Women

The United Nations Entity for Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women,

Reaffirming the sovereign right and regional autonomy of all nations to determine their own social, cultural, religious, and legal systems,

Recognizing that women's economic inequality is a structural and highly urgent issue,

Alarmed by the unfair division of unpaid labour and women's underrepresentation in high-paying sectors,

Noting that gender equality is helpful for economic growth,

Acknowledging that family responsibilities and careers remain a challenge for many women,

Observing the high percentage of women in need of assistance,

Proposes the strengthening of the opportunity framework in employment while respecting national Labour systems and economic capacities,

Keeping in mind family as an important part of society and encouraging governments to add and keep policies that protect motherhood and family stability,

1. **Encourages** the expansion of care infrastructure featuring:
 - (a) the protection of vulnerable women such as refugee women and women in rural areas,
 - (b) Investments in childcare and childhood education,
 - (c) Equalized parental leave,
 - (d) Investments in elderly care,
 - (e) Investments in care for people with disabilities and illnesses;
2. **Encourages** the passing of laws establishing women's basic rights, for example:
 - (a) land ownership rights,
 - (b) inheritance rights,
 - (c) property rights,
 - (d) Right to physical and bodily autonomy;

3. **Calls** for the implementation of a fund including all involved member states, each contributing an individual amount relative to their economic capacity which will function as a funding mechanism for governmental projects and projects by NGOs and IGOs, aimed at ensuring the equal economic participation of women and which will be divided on basis of necessity, while misuse of funds will be punished by the appropriate sanctions,
4. **Supports** any further ideas and strategies which can be helpful to ensure the standing of women in economic and social fields;
5. **Encourages** member states to invest in education to provide access to quality education for women, including:
 - (a) primary and secondary school through expanded scholarships especially for women,
 - (b) education to enable women to possibly take on leadership roles,
 - (c) vocational training, especially in high-growth sectors such as technology, agriculture, manufacturing, renewable energy,
 - (d) digital literacy,
 - (e) financial literacy,
 - (f) education on women's rights;
6. **Calls** for continued dialogue among Member States based on mutual respect, non-interference, and recognition of cultural diversity and in approaches to women's development;
7. **Strongly urges** member states to strengthen legislation and policies to promote gender equality in economic participation, including eliminating discriminatory laws that restrict women's access to employment, property, and finance.
8. **Invites** all nations to establish platforms for women affected by any kind of female specific struggles for consultation of and advice from trained experts, as well as exchange with other women in similar situations.
